It is imperative to ignore any associated with 'getting an MBA' as inadequate.


There has to be a much more personal reason to your study that connects the degree with your own interest and sense of enthusiasm.

You are becoming frustrated with seeming different suggestions and requirements coming from your academic subject tutors.


At the same time you become frustrated with getting different pieces of information when you ask your classmates about their opinion for the assignment.

Right Questions Get The Right Answers

Academic tutors will not tell you the following but they are strongly biased towards you. They think that you might be approaching them in order to achieve a short-cut. They think that you are looking for simple and direct answers to the academic challenges.

You might be getting a very different reaction from what you might be expecting.

Tutors might provide you with little information and will also encourage you to go out and find the answer yourself.

However, such reaction is making you even more frustrated because you are confident that you are genuinely interested in learning and developing your knowledge.

In order to avoid getting into difficulties with your tutor spend time constructing questions that remain more 'subject-related' rather than 'assignment-related'. Hence, identify ways where you can ask questions that focus on the ideas and content covered in the lectures.

Identify areas that require further clarification and demonstrated that you have followed the content covered by your tutor. Moreover, identify a *follow-up strategy* where the questions are slowly emerging and they start with being 'generic' to becoming 'narrow'.

Avoid getting all your questions answered during the first consultation. Instead, plan for at least four consultations and demonstrate that there is a build up process in your understanding and thinking.

By developing this approach you will be winning the tutor to your side and you will find much easier to extract the relevant information.

By asking the right questions that do not suggest that you want direct answers to the assignment question, you demonstrate interest!

Your tutors will start paying more attention to you as an individual student and how you fit with the rest of the academic cohort.
